

Year 5 Work at home pack

Please find below activities for each subject and a timetable. You will see that the activities set are linked to all areas of the curriculum and there should be enough here to last two weeks. Some of the activities are on worksheets and some are stand-alone. You can either print the worksheets or you can use them like a textbook and write on pieces of paper or put into an exercise book or notebook if you have one. You could also use your usual homework books to complete work in. Please name everything or if you are working in a book make it clear which activity you are doing. There is enough work on here to last two weeks. Please see the attached timetable for how we split our time across the week.

Maths

- Mathematics – Please complete the tasks set on your log in page. Use the tutorials to help if you need them.
- Times Tables– Please continue to practise these several times a week. There are many apps out there to support this.
- I have attached the unit for decimals. We follow the **White Rose Hub scheme**. This is a new unit of work so there has been no pre-teaching. You will have done some work with decimals before, especially in the context of money. The children will know that questions 1-3 are relatively 'easy' but 4 – 6 are trickier. Again look at completing one activity a day, they are all labelled and follow on from each other. Practise using money and do some addition, subtraction, multiplication and division sums to keep your brain ticking over. There is enough for two weeks worth of work.

English

Reading – please read daily and record in your reading record. Choose a variety of texts to read and aim to read for around 20 minutes each day.

Comprehension - Complete the comprehension papers; you will have two sets of assessments, one for each week. Remember to answer in full sentences and put in the correct punctuation.

Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling – There are two activities, see homework grid. Spelling games also attached.

PE

- Practice your throwing and catching skills in the garden. Remember it is all about skill and not just power.
- Can you create a set of fitness skills that you can use to train for 10 minutes? These can be set to music or to counting. You could include shuttle runs, skipping or star jumps. Write down your fitness routine and we will share them when we are back in school.
- You have been learning how to play tag rugby – Do some research on the game. Who invented it? How has the game evolved over time? How do you train to play professionally? What information can you find about national teams?
- Some of you have also been working on your swimming skills – Watch some footage on the internet about swimming and look at how you can improve your technique. Try some dry swimming on the sitting room floor or your bed.

Science

History

Research what the Ancient Sumerians invented. Write about how these inventions impact on our lives today. Draw each of them.	Ancient Sumerian writing is called Cuneiform. Can you find out what letters the marks represent? Write a message in Cuneiform.	Create your own Cuneiform tablet either in Playdo, plastercine or salt dough.
Research and write about the different Gods/Goddesses that the Ancient Sumerians believed in.	Draw, paint or make one of the Ancient Sumerian Gods/Goddesses.	SPAG- Learn and practice how we use apostrophe for contraction e.g. can not =can't. How many words can you find?
SPAG-learn and practice how we use the apostrophe for possession, both singular and plural. Can you write 10 sentences showing how they are used?	Use Google translate or a French dictionary to identify how to say the following words: Sea Beach Sky Boat Cliff Cave Practice saying them out loud!	Create your own beach scene picture and label the key features in French.
Science – Air resistance Design and make a parachute to test air resistance. See attached investigation sheet	Science – Water resistance Design and make a boat using junk modelling. Can you make it float in the bath, and able to withstand other forces, eg wind (could you use a fan) Record your experiment and findings.	Writing – We have been reading The Boy at the back of the class. Can you write a persuasive letter to The Queen asking her to help find Ahmet's parents? Remember all of the key features we have learnt in class.
